Rejoice in the Resurrection!

In the days and weeks ahead we will remember and celebrate what we hold to be the defining event of human history, certainly the cornerstone of the Christian faith - the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Although we commemorate our Lord's death on our behalf every Communion Sunday and celebrate his resurrection every Sunday, we all need this annual extended season of concentrated focus to reorient and re-prioritize our lives to that which is *of first importance*, to use Paul's words.

Last Sunday **Tony's** powerful message, *The Necessity of the Resurrection*, launched our Resurrection sermon series. Next Sunday we will examine the many evidences for our Lord's resurrection. Luke called them *many infallible proofs*. Our Good Friday service, perhaps the most spiritually moving service of our year, will focus our minds and hearts on our Lord's sacrificial death, culminating in Communion on our knees before God. On Easter Sunday we will recount what Fulton Oursler called *The Greatest Story Ever Told*. The following week will find us asking, "So what? What

significant difference does the reality of our Lord's resurrection make in my daily life?"

To maximize the blessings of this most-important Christian season and experience a significant difference, I suggest the following.

1. On each day till Easter, read (and re-read) 1 Corinthians 15,

sometimes all 58 verses at a time, sometimes just a few. In addition, read at least one of the Gospel accounts of our Lord's death and resurrection. (Matthew 26-28; Mark 14-16; Luke 22-24; John 13-21). If you have a *Harmony of the Gospels*, I encourage you to use it, comparing the four accounts. Choose a quiet place and give yourself some extra time to draw near to God, remembering his promise that if you will draw near to God, he will draw near to you (James 4:8a). It will do us all good to check that passage and read on through verse 10, applying it as needed. (Let me know if you do so, and I'll share a personal incident from long ago!

2. As you are able, please attend these next services, especially our Good Friday service.

As you probably have observed, many in the Redeemer family are experiencing difficult times of trials and testing. As always you have responded and continue to respond to needs and opportunities as they become known. Grant Colfax Tullar's classic poem is an encouraging reminder for us all.

In a word, rejoice in the Resurrection!

Peter Mitskevich's Visit

On Sunday, March 4, our missionary to Russia, Peter Mitskevich, gave a compelling overview of the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of the Russian people and an encouraging glimpse of the growing ministries with which he is



involved in Russia. Peter, who preached from Hebrews 12:1-3, was a medical doctor for 10 years in Moscow. He currently pastors Golgotha Church in Moscow, and is vice president of the Union of Evangelical Churches of Russia. He mentors other pastors, has a radio show, and assists with the Russian radio broadcast of *Insight For Living*. Peter and his wife **Tatiana** have four children and are expecting their fifth soon.

Andrea, an only child, was born in Chihuahua, Mexico. Her ancesters on her father's side were immigrants from Spain, and on her mother's side, from Italy. Andrea knew she was very blessed to be born in a Christian home. She remarked, "I grew up in both Baptist and Methodist churches and was very active until I got married! I remember during my first five years of life, we lived on a college campus, located in Saltillo, Coahuila, close to Monterrey. My father was a professor and my mother was the nurse. The other residents were all single adults, missionaries, and teachers.

"As an adult, professing my faith meant facing daily rejection, hostility, and closed doors to any opportunities. However, through this environment, the Lord strengthened my beliefs!"

Andrea told of her youthful dreams to be an airline stewardess and to travel all over the world meeting interesting people. Instead, she married and became a homemaker and a mother. "My first home as a married woman was in Wertheim, Germany, near Warzburg. But then we moved to El Paso, Texas, then to Dallas. I have two sons, **Ismael** and **Andrew**, and four grandchildren." Andrea was one of the first students to attend Richland College when it opened several years ago. "I was so happy to earn my associate degree in business," she reported, "even though I did not go to work right away because my sons were still so young, and I felt I should wait until they were older. Presently, I am single and live in Garland. I work at Allstate Insurance Company as a claim support associate. It takes me four to five hours to commute to and from work!"

Finally, Andrea told how the Lord ministered to her during the worst time of her life. She described how her world was turned upside down, and she prayed that God would take her. She continued, "When I look back now, I realize that going through that suffering turned into a great blessing for me, because spiritual growth came out of it." She continued, "Approximately two years ago I was serving on jury duty in Dallas when I met Gail Boyne. I told her I was looking for a church and she invited me to Redeemer and the Berean Adult Bible Fellowship. Dr. Waters' teaching and the love that everyone shares in the class and at Redeemer make me feel the presence of God. The church is such a blessing in my life."
