In reminiscing we sometimes say, "It seems like just yesterday when . . ." Well, it doesn't actually seem like yesterday when twenty-five of us met at the Casa Linda Cafeteria on May 22, 1999, to talk about starting a church in the White Rock area. But neither does it seem like ten years! The old saying is true: Time flies when we're having fun! Time has flown, at least for me; but fun doesn't begin to describe our life together in the Redeemer family these ten years. There have been fun and lots of laughter along the way; but, far deeper and more durable, there has been *joy*.
