In a Word

It's good to remember

We have just celebrated our tenth anniversary as a church. What a time of joyful remembrance of God's good hand of blessing, his unfailing guidance, his abundant provision, as well as his unfailing grace and comfort in our times of grief and loss. It's good to reflect, to savor the memories of God's past provision and blessing. In fact, it's downright biblical! Here are a few of Moses' final words to the Israelites as they verged on the promised land: Remember how the Lord your God led you all the way . . . be careful you do not forget. Hebrews 10:32 – Remember those earlier days...

In preparation for our celebration and this *In a Word*, I browsed my file of LINKS. Our very first LINK headlined our First Anniversary Celebration! "Please bring a main dish and either a vegetable or salad to feed your family plus two other people." Aren't you ladies glad we catered our tenth? That first edition welcomed the arrival of Josh and Emily Bailey. Tony Gomillion would join the team a few months later. Blake Barbre was already on board, as was Carolyn Owens, who began producing bulletins and letters almost from week one! Kristen Raikes and her family were also early members, but at age 15, Kristen was still a little young to be our Director of Children's ministries! Who'd have thought? Eunice Tavaglione and **Buddy Wallace** joined the team in 2002, shortly after we acquired our present property. Alice and I regularly and enthusiastically thank God for these gifted men and women, who contribute so much to make Redeemer what it is. I'm sure you do as well.

Leafing through the LINKS reminded me that many of the ministries that help make Redeemer what it is were begun in our earliest months, before we had a place to call our own and our resources were few. Our beginnings were small but sturdy. For instance, we began with one Adult Bible Fellowship, soon to grow to two, three, now seven. Thanks to some of you creative and talented leaders, our earliest children and youth ministries flourished in spite of limited resources.

I was reminded that for our first baptism the First Assembly of God graciously lent us their sanctuary. How's that for fore-shadowing? I had forgotten that **Bethany Gomillion** was the first baby dedicated at Redeemer. Geiger Island trips began that first year, as did our women's and men's ministries.

Our special services that mean so much to us — Christmas Eve and Good Friday — were begun in our first year, and early on they too were celebrated in the borrowed sanctuary that is now our own.

Our earliest missions investments included Asian Christian Academy in India with **Joy and Leela George**, and Word of Life Hungary with **Dave and Karen James**. Missions trips to Guatemala and Hungary soon followed, and a steadily growing missions ministry now includes nine missionary families in eight countries.

Local outreach began with tutoring in neighborhood schools, then grew to include the White Rock Center of Hope, Boy Scouts, Pioneer Girls, and Girls of Grace, and a vital ministry in juvenile detention centers.

My LINK stroll stirred memories of Operation Christmas Child, VBS, teens serving in west Dallas, volunteer appreciation picnics, and Thanksgiving banquets. But the Behind-the-Curtain and Getting-to-Know-You profiles affirmed to me that with all our many blessings, you the Redeemer family are the greatest blessing. You are what make our fellowship what it is.

In a word . . . it's good to remember!


Our missionaries Dave and Karen James have faithfully

Sensing God's leading in a new ministry direction, the Jameses departed Word of Life Hungary in January 2009 and are now living in Chattanooga, TN.

While daughter Becky completes her high school junior year through home-schooling and son Chris wraps up his second year of Bible School in Hungary, Dave, Karen, and others have launched the "Alliance for Biblical Integrity" (ABI). This parachurch ministry is aimed at establishing a network of like-minded churches, educational institutions, missions organizations and individual Christian leaders who will work together to respond to relevant world issues from a truly biblical perspective. The James' transition to ABI means that Redeemer will no longer support them each month as "field missionaries," but they will forever be a part of our extended church family. Ann Fleming's family moved from Buffalo, New York, to Fairfield, Iowa, when she was two years old. There she and her younger brother enjoyed what could be described an ideal childhood. Ann remembered, "We spent the cold evenings playing many games, and we had fun playing with our friends in the neighborhood." She continued, "We loved to hike in the woods, walk along the small creeks, and check out the apples in the orchard at the near-by college campus. Years later, when Ann was fifteen, her

years later, God would change my fear into a believing faith, at which time God welcomed me into His family. What a great blessing!"

Jim Fleming was born in Seminole, Oklahoma; but he and his family moved frequently, causing him to attend eight different schools before he graduated from Oklahoma State University. Jim lettered in basketball and track at the university, and admitted that being an athlete helped him to be accepted in the many schools he attended! After Ann graduated from the University of Iowa, she went to work for IBM. It was there that she fell in love with "a handsome salesman named Jim Fleming!" She told how they met in January, 1963, became engaged in May, married in August, and moved to Dallas a couple of months before John F. Kennedy was assassinated.

She exclaimed, "What an exciting year that was, and what a way to begin our life in Texas!"

Jim and Ann have two married daughters who live in Georgia and Minnesota. They also are the proud grandparents of four delightful grandchildren. Then there's Wesley, the cat their daughter left with them. Jim commented, "Ann, Wesley, and I are growing old together, and having a great time doing so!"


The Flemings testify to God's faithfulness in their lives, particularly during the '70s and '80s, when Ann's stepmother died; and her dad, as well as Jim's mom, developed Alzheimer's. At the same

time, their daughter was suffering from severe depression, and they realized Jim's colon cancer had metastasized. Amid these tragic events and other changes, Ann confirmed, "God proved His love over and over. He showed us how He goes through life with us, not against us. He was with us every step of the way."

Jim and Ann were members of and served at Fellowship Bible Church before coming to Redeemer. Ann joyously added: "That is where I accepted Christ as my Savior."

Jim concluded: "When we came to Redeemer, we knew it was an answer to our prayers. The love and care, worship and praise, meaningful music, and wonderful teaching have blessed both of us. Jim and Ann serve as greeters and in other men's and women's ministries. We are very thankful that they are such a significant part of the Redeemer family.
