Local Ministries that Need You

The Redeemer family is serious about loving needy people from our community in practical ways that point them to Jesus. On the third Saturday of each month Redeemer volunteers staff the White Rock Center of Hope to help disadvantaged people in East Dallas meet their most basic needs (food, clothing, emergency rent assistance, etc.). Each Monday evening a team visits troubled youth at the Henry Wade Correctional Facility to share the good news of Jesus, read short Bible stories, and pray for their requests. At convenient times during the normal school week, Redeemer tutors spend 30 minutes helping students at Riley Elementary and Highland Meadows Elementary learn to read. Each of these ministries needs help.

Redeemer to Support Strategic Church and Mission Station Plant in Northeast India

Redeemer Bible Church will soon have a sister church in Assam, a strategically located state in northeast India. Assam is surrounded by Nepal, Bhutan, Bangladesh, and Myanmar (Burma) [see graphic on next page]. As one of their outreach ministries, The Asian Christian Academy (led by Joy and Leela George and supported by Redeemer) is establishing churches that in turn become outreach stations, training pastors and planting churches in the area. This initiative in Assam will be ACA's latest church/outreach plant. As with their other outreaches, it will be led by one of their seminary graduates. Jacob and Grace Ahmed (pictured right), themselves Muslim

In a word, make the most of your summer!



My dad is a theologian and a writer, and I still maintain his Web site, where he posts his essays." Susan was born in Summit, New Jersey, while her parents were on furlough from their ministry as missionaries to the Mam Indians in the highlands of Guatemala. She remembered, "I spent four years in Guatemala, and I have a great fondness for Huehuetenango, the MK school I attended during my fourth and fifth-grade years. My two brothers (David and Peter) and I were so privileged to grow up with a first-hand

understanding of a culture that is so different from ours."
