

God described them as *skilled men (and women) to whom I have given wisdom in such matters.* The word is also used for skill in warfare, in sailing, and by implication would include the skills of many others such as singers, musicians, and dancers, all of whom are described as using their God-given abilities to glorify God and benefit others.

So we salute these for their recent achievements as they remind us that *each one should use whatever gift he has received, to serve others.*
