It is a JOY to partner with West Dallas Community Church. For seven years now, Redeemer's youth have given six hours of their day for two weeks to show kids in the West Dallas neighborhood that God loves them. This year, our Lord paved the way for refugee kids from Africa to soak in that love. After our youth ride the bus to pick up the refugees, they join with volunteers from West Dallas and Bent Tree Bible Church to lead the children. Smiles cover kids' faces as they pile off buses to jump in inflatables, play basketball, sing songs, listen to stories about Jesus, and eat dinner. All of this topped off with a snow cone from our snow cone machine, new this year, complete with labels for the snow cones that read "God loves you - John 3:16."

Central to the Bible Study Outback. Along the way they will visit Missions Harbor, Crafts Crossing, Recreation Rock, and the G'Day Café! Each of these Australian sites will be filled with adventure, as kids discover how important it is to have a relationship with God's Son through Lifeway's Boomerang Express: Where it all comes back to Jesus.

Getting to Know You: Robert and Connie Sherrill

In 2003 on a stormy winter day, Robert and Connie ran into each other at a grocery store where neither one of them normally shopped! Connie shared: "My mom had recently passed away. I was lonely and had begun to realize how much I needed Christ in my daily walk. Robert and I had not seen each other in fifteen years when we met in the store that day. We both felt God's hand was in our meeting. We married one year later." Robert added: "Connie is a wonderful wife and mother, and a great inspiration to me."

"With our beautiful two-year-old daughter, Sadie. and three rescue dogs, our house is always full of love and activity." Connie related that she was the youngest of six children, which included a sibling who died at birth, and her oldest brother, Benny, who had

Down syndrome. Connie continued, "Throughout Benny's life, I saw an example of unconditional love. He was always happy, except when the Dallas Cowboys lost! When he was 16, he pretended to be my parents, flashing the porch light on and off, as I returned home from a first date! My mom was going through a difficult time and was rarely home. My dad spent most of the time in bed as a result of a broken back, but Benny was always there for me. Sadly, Benny died five days before Sadie was born."

In 1979, Connie attended a church camp, where she accepted Jesus as her Savior. She shared, "I began reading the Bible regularly, and I believe that my salvation decision and being in God's Word helped prepare me for my dad's suicide, which occurred when I was twelve." Robert remarked, "Connie's

level of faith is amazing, even with the stress she experienced."

> Robert grew up in Olney, Texas, where he was involved in the youth activities and choir at the First Baptist Church. He accepted Christ when he was eight years old. Robert, an only child, graduated from Midwestern State University with a degree in accounting. He is currently an audit manager for the American Heart Association. Connie was also

in the financial industry for 20 years but is now a stay-at-home mom, and enjoys volunteering in the Redeemer nursery and at the White Rock Center of Hope. She is also secretary of the Lochwood Parents Association. Robert loves to fly fish and makes his own rods out of bamboo. He explained, "These rods are like the ones they used 70 years ago, and

it requires about 50 hours to make each one." He enjoys God's beautiful surroundings when fishing, and he agreed with a friend who said, "God doesn't put trout in ugly places!"

The Sherrills, wanting a smaller church closer to their home, came to Redeemer. They agree that the teaching and encouragement to memorize scripture has produced spiritual growth. Connie added, "The church body is filled with people who show Christ's love!" Thanks, Sherrills for becoming significant members of the Redeemer family.
