### Congregational Meetings August 13 and 20 to Consider Land Sale

Over the past seven years of our life as a church God has faithfully guided our steps, opening doors and closing them, teaching us when to wait and when to move ahead. We have enjoyed a spirit of love and unity in all our congregational deliberations and decisions. Once again, it is decision time. This time it concerns the sale of the one-acre lot across Lake Highlands Drive from our playground that we acquired with the purchase of our present property. After careful and prayerful consideration, our church leaders have concluded that, because of the hill that hides fast oncoming traffic, it is not safe to develop for either future parking or buildings. The church

has now received a written offer in the amount of \$250,000, its appraised value, to purchase that property. The prospective buyer wants to build a few town houses on it and live there himself. The joint boards (elders and deacons) have recommended to the membership that we accept this offer. They have called an informal town hall meeting at 6:00 PM on Sunday evening, August 13, to discuss the proposal, to be followed by an official congregational business meeting at 6:00 PM on August 20 to vote on the proposal. While the discussion and the vote are limited to voting members, regular attenders are welcome to attend both meetings.
