Search Committee Update

The search for a new senior pastor has been under way for several months now, and, while the Search Committee doesn't know when a candidate will be recommended, it is making progress.

Committee members have reviewed the resumes of nearly 70 men. In many cases, if their resumes reflected the qualifications outlined by the Board of Elders, members have listened to their sermons. Committee members have met face-to-face with some men and have visited churches to observe potential candidates in the pulpit.

The search has been active about four months. It's not unusual for pastoral searches to last up to a year. God has the right person for us, and we all look forward to the time when he can be introduced to the Redeemer family.

Fall Sermon Series: Nehemiah



Gideons at Redeemer

Serving as an outreach of the church

‘What attracted me to Gideons was the opportunity to win others to Christ’

John Gibson, a retired engineer, estimates that he has personally handed out more than 50,000 Bibles in the 34 years since he joined Gideons International. He’s one of more than 287,000 members and auxiliary members in more than 190 countries who have placed or distributed more than 1.7 billion Bibles and New Testaments since this remarkable ministry was founded more than 100 years ago. About 78.9 million copies of God’s Word were distributed in 2011.

Four Redeemer members — Don Rose, Don Owens, J. Lon Kimbrell and John — are active members of Gideons. A representative gave a brief overview of the ministry during our July 22 worship service, and The Link spent a few minutes with John to learn more about his involvement.



Why are you a member of Gideons International?

What attracted me to Gideons — and still does — was the opportunity to win others to Christ. A pastor told me not long ago, “We don’t save anybody. The Word of God does that.” I had to agree with him. That’s what happens.

What do members of Gideons do?

We put Scripture in the traffic lanes of the world where people who would never darken the doors of a church will come across it and God will use it. ... The Gideons can do things and go places a church can’t go. For instance, a hotel would never let a church put Bibles in their hotels. They might be concerned that they would have to let everybody put all kinds of stuff in there. But the Gideons can go there as business and professional men, and they’ll let us put Bibles in their hotels. We really are an outreach of the church.

Where else do you place and distribute Bibles?

In addition to hotels, we distribute Bibles in schools, universities, hospitals, nursing homes, jails and prisons, airplanes and ships, to police and firefighting personnel, and to the offices of lawyers and doctors.

Churchwide effort

“This was truly a churchwide effort,” said Paul Ramler, chairman of the Missions Leadership Team. “Prayers, financial and material support, and everyone’s involvement saw

the lives of Hungarian teens changed for all eternity. The person who brought a bag of clothes to the garage sale played a part, as did the person who helped clean up, and the people who prayed prior to, during and still continue to pray all played essential roles. This is the body of Christ on display at Redeemer Bible Church.”

Pray for campers

And while we celebrate, at least 40 new Christian teens in Hungary now face trials. At camp, they were surrounded by Christian love, fellowship and nurturing support. Now, away from camp, they most likely face disapproval from family members, friends and secular society. Most have no church nearby for support or fellowship. Despite Hungary being Christian in culture and history, only 6 percent of Hungarians attend church and only 2 percent are born-again believers. Our sincere and continuous prayers for these new believers are essential.

Could the Lord be prompting you to go in 2013? That is our prayer!


